Worm Management Policy (June 2023)

At Hurston Dressage and Eventing (HDE), we do our utmost to ensure that all land is managed appropriately and efficiently, and horse welfare is a top priority. This includes the management of worms and other parasites. We ask that all our liveries adhere to the following policy:

- All horses must either be wormed with an appropriate wormer (as directed by veterinary advice) every quarter OR have a worm count conducted at least twice a year
- Worm counts are preferable to worming blind
- If a worm count is returned as positive, treatment is given in accordance with the advice of the laboratory that conducted the worm count
- Paddocks are cleaned at least once a week, if not more often
- Harrowing and rolling take place at least twice a year on all paddocks
- Paddocks are given an appropriate time to rest after being harrowed and rolled before horses are put back out on them
- It is recommended that all horses undergo a saliva test for tapeworm a minimum of once per year
- All owners of new horses coming to HDE must provide evidence of a clear worm count within the last three months, OR provide the date and make of their last wormer (also within the previous three months)
- Should livery clients want to conduct their own worm counts and/or follow their own worming routine, provided that evidence is shown to management at least twice per year, this is acceptable

As standard, the routine we adhere to is as follows:

March: Worm count – treat as necessary June: Worm count – treat as necessary September: Worm count and tapeworm saliva test – treat as necessary December: Worm count – treat as necessary
